Project Title: Eland Solar Project (California Endangered Species Act Incidental Take Permit No. 2081-2020-013-04 (ITP)), Minor Amendment No.1.

Project Location: The project is located both east and west of State Highway 14, approximately 5 miles north, northwest of the City of California in an unincorporated area of Kern County.


Project Description: This proposed project involves construction and operation of a 500-megawatt solar photovoltaic electrical generating facility supported by a 230-kilovolt generation-intertie electrical transmission line and collector path corridor. Permanent facilities associated with the Project include solar modules, service roads, energy storage system, substation, inverter stations, and operation and maintenance facilities.

The Project will result in permanent impacts to 2,484.32 acres of desert tortoise (*Gopherus agassizii*) and Mohave ground squirrel (*Xerospermophilus mohavensis*) habitat. The project is expected to result in incidental take of desert tortoise and Mohave ground squirrel, which are designated as a threatened species under the California Endangered Species Act. The ITP referenced above as issued by CDFW authorizes incidental take of species listed under CESA that may occur as a result of Project implementation. Minor Amendment No.1 modifies compensatory mitigation language related to a Co-Management Agreement, removes references to the Enhancement and Monitoring Plan requirements, and removes reference to the Robbers Roost location.
