Project Title: Magnolia Channel Routine Maintenance Project (Streambed Alteration Agreement No. 1600-2020-0096-R6)

Project Location: The project is located in Magnolia Channel, tributary to the Santa Ana River, south of Edison Avenue, north of Merrill Avenue, east of Central Avenue, and west of Euclid Avenue, in the City of Chino, County of San Bernardino, State of California; Latitude: 33.993209 N, Longitude: -117.671295 W. The channel starts south of Satterfield Way, west of Mountain Avenue, travels south past Eucalyptus Avenue, and ends at Appalachian Street.

Project Description: The California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW) has executed Streambed Alteration Agreement number 1600-2020-0096-R6, pursuant to section 1602 of the Fish and Game Code to the project Applicant, the City of Chino. The Magnolia Channel Routine Maintenance Project includes channel maintenance and invasive species removal to allow continual water movement down the channel to prevent the presence of standing water or thatching of fallen or dead cattails that provide breeding grounds for mosquitoes.

This is to advise that CDFW, acting as a Responsible Agency, approved the above described project on September 1, 2020 and has made the following determinations regarding the project pursuant to California Code of Regulations section 15096, subdivision (i):

1. The project will / will not have a significant effect on the environment. This determination is limited to effects within CDFW's permitting jurisdiction as a Responsible Agency.
