**Site History**

The Whitmore Gap Filler Annex Formerly Used Defense Site is located in Shasta County, 33 miles northeast of Redding. It is situated on top of Clover Mountain in the Lassen National Forest. In 1959, the United States acquired the site for use as an Air Defense Command Installation radar site. In 1961, the property was transferred to the U.S. Department of Agriculture, U.S. Forest Service and to the U.S. Department of the Interior, Bureau of Land Management.

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers indicates the only evidence of the former radar site is a concrete pad that was once part of the concrete radar control building, and concrete and metal building debris. The Corps also indicates that numerous pipes and conduit protruding from the concrete pad indicate the possible existence of underground storage tanks (USTs).

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
