*There are three State carbon monoxide standards, a 1-hour standard of 20 parts per million that applies statewide, an 8-hour standard of 6.0 parts per million that applies only in the Lake Tahoe Air Basin (LTAB), and an 8-hour standard of 9.0 parts per million that applies in all other areas except LTAB. The 8-hour LTAB standard is not to be equaled or exceeded, while the other two are not to be exceeded.*
