

10 FINAL EIR/EIS DISTRIBUTION

Since publication of the Palmdale to Burbank Section Draft Environmental Impact Report/Environmental Impact Statement (EIR/EIS), this chapter has been revised to reflect notice and distribution of the Final EIR/EIS and to reflect changes in elected officials.

Distribution of the Palmdale to Burbank Project Section Final EIR/EIS emphasizes the use of electronic media to ensure cost-effective, broad availability to the public and interested parties.

The Draft and Final EIR/EIS (Volume 1), technical appendices (Volume 2), and alignment plans (Volume 3), in addition to Volume 4 of the Final EIR/EIS (responses to comments), which comprises the entire Draft and Final EIR/EIS are available on the California High-Speed Rail Authority's web site (<https://hsr.ca.gov/>). Electronic copies of the entire Draft and Final EIR/EIS are available at no cost to all members of the public upon request at the office of the California High-Speed Rail Authority (700 L Street, Suite 800, Sacramento, CA 95814) and its Southern California regional office (355 South Grand Avenue, Suite 2050, Los Angeles, CA 90071).¹ Paper copies of the four-volume Final EIR/EIS will be available at the California High-Speed Rail Authority offices. Volume 1 of the Final EIR/EIS may be reviewed at select public libraries in the project vicinity (listed in Section 10.1). Copies of the four-volume Final EIR/EIS also may be accessed at the repository libraries (open days/hours may be reduced for compliance with COVID-19 public health and safety directives).

All persons, agencies, and organizations listed in Sections 10.2 through 10.8 of this chapter have been informed of the availability of and locations to obtain the entire Final EIR/EIS. With the exception of newly elected officials, all people, agencies, and organizations listed below previously received notice of availability of the Draft EIR/EIS and have been notified of the availability of the Final EIR/EIS. Elected officials were updated to reflect the results of the 2022 elections, and 52 new officials have been informed of the availability of the Final EIR/EIS.

Notice of availability of the entire Final EIR/EIS has been published in the *Federal Register* in compliance with the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA). Repositories and cooperating federal agencies were sent paper and/or electronic copies, as applicable, of the Final EIR/EIS in compliance with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) and NEPA. Electronic copies were filed with the California State Clearinghouse in compliance with CEQA and through the e-NEPA electronic filing system in compliance with NEPA and its implementing regulations.

Los Angeles County received an electronic copy of the Final EIR/EIS. All federal agencies, state agencies, and selected interested parties listed below in Sections 10.2 through 10.8 received copies of the Final EIR/EIS in compliance with CEQA and NEPA. The Executive Summary has been translated into the primary languages used throughout the Palmdale to Burbank area, including Spanish, Armenian, and Arabic. Federal, state, and county elected officials, mayors of cities with proposed stations, and the potentially affected local agencies listed below were mailed a fact sheet and instructions on how to access a copy of the entire Final EIR/EIS. Additional local elected officials, agency representatives, and all others on the project mailing list have been mailed a notification that includes information about how to access the entire Final EIR/EIS. Property owners and building occupants within or nearby the Build Alternative footprints have also received information regarding the Final EIR/EIS. Notification of the availability of the Final EIR/EIS was also distributed through the California High-Speed Rail Authority's social media accounts, the HSR website (<https://hsr.ca.gov/>), and by email distribution to individuals who provided email addresses for the project mailing list.

All Draft EIR/EIS commenters, at a minimum, received notification of the availability of the Final EIR/EIS (see Volume 4, Responses to Comments on the Draft EIR/EIS, for the list of all commenters).
