
**PROJECT LOCATION:** The Project will occur within Los Angeles County, California, near the Santa Clara River, in the City of Santa Clarita.

**PROJECT DESCRIPTION:** An advanced water treatment (AWT) facility will be constructed and operated on site at the Valencia Water Reclamation Plant (WRP). The AWT facility will be a small-scale desalination facility that uses microfiltration (MF) for pretreatment followed by reverse osmosis (RO) for chloride removal. The MF/RO will be constructed in the northern part of the Valencia WRP across from the chlorine contact tanks in the area allocated for future expansion of the treatment facilities. A decarbonator for pH adjustment and a small chemical storage station consisting of storage tanks and injection pumps will be constructed near the MF/RO facilities. Operation of the AWT facility will result in production of brine that will be trucked offsite for proper disposal, anticipatedly at the Joint Water Pollution Control Plant in the City of Carson.

This is to advise that the State Water Board made the following California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) determinations and approved CWSRF financing on July 16, 2019 for the Project:

1. Determinations were made pursuant to the CEQA.
2. The State Water Board considered the Environmental Impact Report (EIR) as prepared by the District for this Project.
3. A Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Program was adopted by the District for this Project.
4. Mitigation measures were made a condition of the District's approval of the Project.
5. A Statement of Overriding Considerations was not adopted by the District for this Project.
6. The Project will not have any adverse significant water quality effects.
