Project Title: SR-91/SR-71 Interchange Improvement Project (Streambed Alteration Agreement No. EPIMS-RIV-18839-R6)

Project Location (include county): The SR71-91 Interchange Improvement Project (Project) is in the vicinity of the existing SR-71/SR-91 Interchange in Riverside County. The western Project limit is approximately 0.10 mile west of the Green River Road interchange along SR-91, and the eastern project limit is 1.3 miles east of the Green River Rd along SR-91. The northern project limit is approximately 1-mile north of SR-91 along SR-71, and the southern project limit is SR-91, in the County of Riverside, State of California. Project activities occur adjacent to the Santa Ana River and associated tributaries, Fresno Canyon Wash and Wardlow Wash.

Project Description: The SR71-91 Interchange Improvement Project proposes to improve the existing SR-71/SR-91 interchange by constructing a new direct flyover connector from eastbound (EB) SR-91 to northbound (NB) SR-71. In addition to the flyover bridge connector, the Green River Road EB onramp will be reconstructed, the SR-71 realigned, and access to properties relocated. The Project for purposes of this Agreement are activities including the grading, filling, and temporary disturbance of 25 ephemeral and intermittent streams referenced as Features A.1, A.2, B.1, C.1, C.2, C.3, D.3, E. F.1, F.2, G.1, G.3, I, J.1, J.2, K.1, K.2, L, N.1, N.2, O.1,P.1,P.2, Q, and R. Specifically, grading and filling of streams in support of bridge abutments, road realignment and water control structures; and temporary impacts to streams associated with construction access.
