Title: Encinitas-Solana Beach Coastal Storm Damage Reduction Project

Applicant: City of Solana Beach

Location: Encinitas City Beach, Solana City Beach, San Diego County (Tide Beach Park, Fletcher Cove, North Seascape Surf Beach Park) and Encinitas (Moonlight Beach to Stone Steps Beach, and D Street Beach to North of Swami's) in the Pacific Ocean, San Diego County.

Description: The project proposes to conduct beach nourishment related activities (sand dredging, placement, and dispersal) to widen area beaches and reduce risks to public safety along two shoreline segments in the Cities of Encinitas and Solana Beach over a fifty-year period. These activities are also being conducted to reduce economic damages from wave-induced erosion of coastal bluffs and the beaches along the shoreline segments and to improve recreational opportunities on the widened beaches. The State Lands Commission action is an approval of a 49-year General Lease – Public Agency Use through February 27, 2071.

This is to advise that the California State Lands Commission, as  Lead Agency  Responsible Agency, approved the above-described project on February 28, 2023, and made the following determinations regarding the project.

- 1) The project  will  will not have a significant effect on the environment.
- 2) An  Environmental Impact Report (EIR) was prepared pursuant to the provisions of CEQA.
- 3) Mitigation measures  were  were not made a condition of the approval of the project.
- 4) A mitigation reporting or monitoring plan  was or  was not adopted for this project.
- 5) A Statement of Overriding Considerations  was  was not adopted for the project.
- 6) Findings  were  were not made pursuant to the provisions of CEQA.

The lead agency for the project, City of Solana Beach certified the Environmental Impact Report (EIR) and Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Program and approved the project on October 14, 2015. The California State Lands Commission has considered the EIR as prepared for this project by the City of Solana Beach and adopted an independent Mitigation Monitoring Program incorporating the City of Solana Beach's document. The EIR and the record of project approval may be examined at the above shown California State Lands Commission Sacramento office address.
