Project Description (Proposed actions, location, and/or consequences).

Supplement 04 discloses newly proposed project areas that are within the scope of the original Big River Watershed Restoration Proposition 40- River Parkways Grant Project- Mitigated Negative Declaration's (MND), SCH#2006072012; the Glenbrook Gulch and M-9 Spur Decommissioning Projects in the Mendocino Headlands State Park. Follow up road assessments have found high priority and maintenance sites requiring work to prevent sedimentation to Big River and Albion River, restore watershed and wildlife functions and allow for critical ingress and egress into the park. This includes: road upgrades with a culvert replacement; decommission of 31 sections of legacy logging skid trails; restoration of 25 stream crossings via removal of culverts, road fill, upslope sediment; re-contour to historic geography; re-vegetate to reduce surface water run-off and sedimentation.

Identify the project's significant or potentially significant effects and briefly describe any proposed mitigation measures that would reduce or avoid that effect.

All prior mitigation measures, best management practices, permitting requirements, monitoring, and maintenance activities, as specified in the original MND, continue to apply for the entirety of the Project, including the additional sites described in the Supplement.

Examples of measures:

-Construction noise from restoration work could potentially impact federal and state listed species; such as, northern spotted owls and marbled murrelets. Mitigation measures are outlined in the MND and include pre-project surveys for avoidance or working outside of the critical nesting season.

-Prior to implementation, all project areas shall be surveyed for rare plant species

If applicable, describe any of the project's areas of controversy known to the Lead Agency, including issues raised by agencies and the public.

The original MND had comment letters submitted regarding re-vegetation, continued road access use for adjacent property owners for commercial timber-hauling, and restoration of the quarry. Supplement 01, 02, and 03 had no known comments.
