Title: Tomales Bay Vessel Management Plan

Applicant: Adam Stoner

Location: Sovereign land in Tomales Bay, adjacent to 19025 Highway 1, near Marshall, Marin County

Description: The Tomales Bay Vessel Management Plan (TBVMP) is the result of a long-term multi-agency effort to streamline and coordinate vessel management activities for the benefit of the public. The TBVMP aims to improve water quality, protect wildlife and habitat, protect public health and ensure recreational opportunities in Tomales Bay. It also implements the mandates and regulations of both Gulf of the Farallones National Marine Sanctuary and California State Lands Commission (Commission). The Commission action is issuing a 10-year General Lease – Recreational Use for a vessel mooring buoy consistent with the TBVMP.

This is to advise that the California State Lands Commission, as  Lead Agency  Responsible Agency, approved the above-described project on October 19, 2023, and made the following determinations regarding the project.

- 1) The project  will  will not have a significant effect on the environment.
- 2) A  Negative Declaration was prepared for this project pursuant to the provisions of CEQA.
- 3) Mitigation measures  were  were not made a condition of the approval of the project.
- 4) A mitigation reporting or monitoring plan  was or  was not adopted for this project.

- 6) Findings  were  were not made pursuant to the provisions of CEQA.
