Title: San Clemente Shoreline Coastal Storm Damage Reduction Project

Applicant: City of San Clemente

Location: Sovereign land in the Pacific Ocean, near San Clemente and Oceanside, Orange and San Diego Counties

Description: The Project consists of dredging material from offshore Oceanside, then hauling and placing it at San Clemente Beach. The Project will have a 50-foot resultant beach width. Beach fill will be 3,412 feet long (4 acres) with an approximate 17-foot crest elevation. The dredge volume is estimated to be approximately 251,130 cubic yards. The State Lands Commission action is an approval of a 49-year General Lease – Public Agency Use through August 17, 2072.

This is to advise that the California State Lands Commission, as Lead Agency Responsible Agency, approved the above-described project on August 17, 2023, and made the following determinations regarding the project.

- 1) The project will will not have a significant effect on the environment.
- 2) An Environmental Impact Report (EIR) was prepared pursuant to the provisions of CEQA.
- 3) Mitigation measures were were not made a condition of the approval of the project.
- 4) A mitigation reporting or monitoring plan was or was not adopted for this project.
- 5) A Statement of Overriding Considerations was was not adopted for the project.
- 6) Findings were were not made pursuant to the provisions of CEQA.

The lead agency for the project, the City of San Clemente (City) certified the Environmental Impact Report (EIR) and Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Program and approved the project on July 18, 2023. The California State Lands Commission has considered the EIR as prepared for this project by the City and adopted an independent Mitigation and Monitoring Program incorporating the City's document.
