Project Location/City/County: The proposed check dams are located on the landside of the RD 2062 Stewart Track, Unit 2, Paradise Cut right (southwest) bank levee and Unit 3, Old River left (north) bank levee, approximately 1 mile northwest of Interstate 5 in the City of Lathrop, San Joaquin County.

Project Description: Approval of Permit No. 19526, under California Code of Regulations, Title 23, Article 3, Section 6, for work within an adopted plan of flood control: To construct six (6) "check dams" between the existing federal levees and the non-federal interior levees with Reclamation District (RD) 2062 (Steward Tract) and to add riprap scour protection at two locations between the federal and non-federal levees. The check dams and scour protection will provide robustness and resiliency to the non-federal interior levee in the event of a breach of the federal levee.

This is to advise that the Board, as the **Responsible Agency**, approved the above-described project on **June 28, 2024** and made the following determinations regarding the above-described project:
