Project Title: Woodman Creek Road Association Sediment Treatment (Lake or Streambed Alteration Agreement No. 1600-2019-0558-R1)

Project Location (include county): The project treats road sections on Woodman Creek Road, which begins approximately two miles north of Laytonville and terminates at the Eel River, in the County of Mendocino, State of California; Sections 16 and 20, Township 22N, Range 14W; Mt. Diablo Base and Meridian, in the Iron Peak and Laytonville, Calif. U.S. Geological Survey 7.5-minute quadrangles.

Project Description: The California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW) has executed Lake and Streambed Alteration Agreement number 1600-2019-0558-R1, pursuant to section 1602 of the Fish and Game Code to the project Applicant, Colin Hughes, representing Pacific Watershed Associates.

The project is limited to 18 encroachments: install/replace culvert at 12 sites; armor diversion along road ditch at two sites, install armored fill at one site, add rock dissipation at one site, and install a vented armored fill at one site. One culvert site will also serve as a point of diversion, with water drafting to a truck. Culverts and crossings will accommodate 100-year flow, including sediment and debris, and will be installed to current standards. Standard treatments include mulching and seeding exposed soil, and replanting trees in-kind at a 3:1 ratio to those removed.

This is to advise that CDFW, acting as a Responsible Agency, approved the above described project on September 30, 2019 and has made the following determinations regarding the project pursuant to California Code of Regulations section 15096, subdivision (i):
