Project Description (Proposed actions, location, and/or consequences).

A Conditional Use Permit to authorize the development of a shooting range that includes individual shooting bays and stages for rifles and pistols, a shotgun range, an area for archery, and the removal, installation and/or reuse of buildings for caretakers, office space and gun smithing, and storage located on two separate parcels covering approximately 85 acres.

The Project site is specifically located on the northeast side of Cajon Boulevard, east and west of the intersection of Cajon Boulevard and Apple White Road, and generally between Cajon Boulevard and Interstate 15 Freeway in the Devore area of San Bernardino County.

The proposed Project represents an expansion of an existing shooting range and the addition of a shotgun range that broadens the physical area associated with shooting activities.

Identify the project's significant or potentially significant effects and briefly describe any proposed mitigation measures that would reduce or avoid that effect.

Potential Effect: The proposed Project could potentially affect the burrowing owl, the adjoining blue line stream, and would include the removal of some mature trees.

Proposed Mitigation Measures include: 1) Conducting burrowing owl surveys; 2) Obtaining a Streambed Alteration Agreement; 3) Installation of a particular barrier or netting acceptable to CDFW; and 4) Conducting a pre-construction nesting bird survey.

Potential Effect: Certain areas of the property may be culturally sensitive.

Proposed Mitigation Measures include: 1) Ceasing of activities if resources are found and Tribal notification; 2) Development of a Monitoring and Treatment Plan in consultation with Tribes; 3) Contact with the County Coroner; 4) Reinitiation of consultation if changes to Project design occur, and; 5) Records are to be supplied to the Tribes.

Potential Effect: Construction noise.

Proposed Mitigation Measures include: 1) Construction equipment shall operate within standards; 2) Construction shall be conducted within specified times, and; 3) Equipment shall be staged away from sensitive receptors.
