Project Description (Proposed actions, location, and/or consequences).

The District proposes to establish and implement its Capital Improvement Program (Proposed Program) to repair, renovate, and revitalize District schools and administration facilities. The program area includes the entire boundary of the District, which is entirely within the jurisdictional boundaries of the City of San Diego in southwestern San Diego County. The repair, renovation, and revitalization projects associated with the Proposed Program would include a wide range of future construction and operational activities on either existing school sites or administration facilities or on new, currently unidentified sites. The Proposed Program consists of eight project categories that represent typical capital improvement projects that could be implemented at any of the District's schools and administrative sites.

The Program EIR will address the following potential project-related and cumulative environmental effects of the proposed project: aesthetics, air quality, biological resources, cultural resources, energy, geology and soils, greenhouse gas emissions and climate change, hazards and hazardous materials, hydrology and water quality, land use and planning, noise and vibration, recreation, transportation, tribal cultural resources, utilities and service systems, and wildfire as well as any other potential impacts identified during the NOP process.
