Project Description (Proposed actions, location, and/or consequences).

The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) proposes to upgrade curb ramps and Accessible Pedestrian Signals to comply with the current Americans with Disabilities Act regulations. The project is in Kern County on State Routes 58 (PM R54.2/R54.6) and 204 (PM R0.0/4.6) in the City of Bakersfield, from the intersection of State Routes 58/204 to "L" Street.

Identify the project's significant or potentially significant effects and briefly describe any proposed mitigation measures that would reduce or avoid that effect.

To avoid impacts to the endangered San Joaquin Kit Fox and nesting birds, Caltrans will implement standard specifications and best management practices. These include preconstruction surveys, exclusion zones, designated environmentally sensitive areas, monitoring as required, speed limits, covering of excavated areas at the end of each workday, proper waste disposal and a restriction on pets, firearms, rodenticides and herbicides.
