The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) proposes a Highway Maintenance project to replace three (3) culverts along State Route (SR) 140 at post miles 9.74, 13.90, and 20.65, within Merced County. The scope of work includes saw cutting and excavating the roadway to remove the culverts, installing the new culverts, and repaving the affected area of pavement. Culverts will be replaced by open trenching. All three culverts will be replaced in-kind. All work will occur within existing Caltrans Right of Way (ROW). General –

- Environmental reevaluation will be required if the scope of the project changes to include additional areas or activities, or if previously unknown cultural or other sensitive resources are discovered. Contact Environmental Office if project changes occur or sensitive resources discovered.

Cultural –

- If cultural resources are discovered at the job site, do not disturb the resources and immediately:
 1. Stop all work within a 60-foot radius of the discovery
 2. Protect the discovery area
 3. Notify the Engineer

The Department investigates. Do not move cultural materials or take them from the job site. Retain a qualified archeologist to assess the significance of the find. Do not resume work within the discovery area until authorized.
- If human remains are discovered, State Health and Safety Code Section 7050.5 states that further disturbances and activities shall cease in any area or nearby area suspected to overlie remains, and the County Coroner should be contacted. Pursuant to Public Resources Code Section 5097.98, if the remains are thought to be Native American, the coroner will notify the Native American Heritage Commission (NAHC) which will then notify the Most Likely Descendent (MLD). At that time, the landowner will work with the MLD on the respectful treatment and disposition of the remains. Further provisions of PRC 5097.98 are to be followed as applicable.

Biology –

- If construction occurs during migratory bird nesting season (February 1 – September 30), a preconstruction bird survey will be required within 14 days before the start of construction. Contact the Environmental office 1 month prior to the start of construction to schedule the survey.
- All construction activities will be limited to when the culverts are dry. The dry season is from August 1 – October 15. Caltrans Standard Special Provision 10-1.03 shall be included in the contract to restrict construction activities to the dry season.

Hazardous Waste –

- Caltrans Standard Special Provision 7-1.02K(6)(j)(iii) pertaining to earth material containing lead, shall be included in the contract.

Permits Required:

- California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW) 1602 Lake and Streambed Alteration Agreement is required for the culvert located at MER/140/13.90
