The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) is proposing a safety project to apply High Friction Surface Treatment (HFST) or Open Graded Hot Mix Asphalt (HMA-OG), at designated locations on Interstate 5 (I-5) and State Route 51 (SR-51) in Sacramento County, on SR-65 in Placer County, and SR-174 in Nevada County. The purpose of this project is to improve pavement friction to reduce the higher than average number of wet weather collisions which have been identified at these specified locations. It is anticipated that 153 collisions will be prevented over the 10-year life of the proposed project.





The project proposes to apply High Friction Surface Treatment (HFST) or Open Graded Hot Mix Asphalt (HMA-OG), at designated locations on Interstate 5 (I-5) and State Route 51 (SR-51) in Sacramento County, on SR-65 in Placer County, and SR-174 in Nevada County.

Staging
