Project Description:

The California Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC), pursuant to authority granted under California Code of Regulations, Title 22, Division 4.5, Chapter 20, Section 66270.61, has issued an Emergency Permit to World Oil Environmental Services (EPA ID# CAD028277036) to transfer hazardous waste from a tanker truck into another truck and/or containers.

The hazardous waste is liquid wash water that was determined to have ignitable hazardous characteristics upon arrival and prior to acceptance, at the K Pure Waterworks water treatment facility. The hazardous waste arrived in a transport truck that does not meet standards for transport or storage of ignitable hazardous waste. The waste is to be repackaged into an approved truck and/or container. Once the hazardous waste is transferred, it will be transported offsite to an authorized facility, World Oil Environmental Recycling located in Compton, California, for treatment, storage, and/or disposal.

Background:

Upon arrival to the K Pure Waterworks facility located at 8910 Rochester Avenue, Rancho Cucamonga, CA 91730, the wash water was tested and found to have a flash point of less than 140°F. This classified the wash water as hazardous waste under California hazardous waste laws. K Pure Waterworks and WOES do not have a permit to manage hazardous waste at the K Pure Waterworks facility and the tanker truck does not meet specifications that would allow it to safely transport ignitable hazardous waste.

Project Activities:

The transfer will be performed in a manner that is protective of the environment by implementing the following controls:

- Personnel performing the transfer must maintain an unobstructed view of the transfer activity allowing for immediate shutdown of the transfer in the event a leak occurs.
- The transfer must occur within K Pure Waterworks' loading/unloading area located within secondary containment.
- Spill pans must be placed under the hose to valve connections.
- To prevent risk to the public, public access is to be restricted during the transfer operation.
- A portable fire extinguisher must be on hand.

Within 10 business days of the expiration of this permit, Superior Ready Mix will submit a final report, signed in accordance with Title 22, California Code of Regulations section 66270.11(d). The report shall include certification that the treatment area has been cleared of all residual hazardous waste generated from this emergency treatment and all generated waste has been properly managed.

The Emergency Permit is effective beginning June 21, 2019 and shall expire on July 5, 2019.

Reasons Why Project is Exempt: This action is necessary to prevent an emergency. Transfer of the ignitable hazardous waste to an approved truck and/or container from a truck that does not meet standards is necessary prior to transportation of an ignitable hazardous waste to a permitted treatment, storage, and disposal facility to prevent accidental ignition and/or fire during transport and ensure safety of the public.
