**Project Title:** Routine Maintenance Agreement, Grayson and Murderers Creeks (Streambed Alteration Agreement No. 1600-2018-0251-R3)

**Project Description:** The California Department of Fish and Wildlife has executed Streambed Alteration Agreement number 1600-2018-0251-R3, pursuant to Section 1602 of the Fish and Game Code to the City of Pleasant Hill, as represented by Ann James.

Routine maintenance activities include sediment removal and vegetation removal at eight separate locations along the creeks. Up to eight (8) cubic yards of silt will be removed from concrete-lined portions of creeks and drainage ditches.


