### **STATE CLEARINGHOUSE**

The California Department of Fish and Wildlife (Department) has reviewed the Negative Declaration (ND) dated September 6, 2019, and revised June 3, 2022, for the above-referenced project (Project). As a trustee for the State's fish and wildlife resources, the Department has jurisdiction over the conservation, protection, and management of fish, wildlife, native plants, and their habitat. As a responsible agency, the Department administers the California Endangered Species Act and other provisions of the Fish and Game Code that conserve the State's fish and wildlife public trust resources. The Department offers the following comments on this Project in our role as a trustee and responsible agency pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act, California Public Resources Code §21000 et seq.

The Project, as described in the ND, is to "legalize an existing non-profit equestrian program that provides its services completely free of charge to children who have been negatively affected by adverse childhood experiences."

The Department consulted on this Project in 2015. No biological resources will be impacted by this Project; therefore, the Department has no comments. If the Project description changes in any way or additional biological resource information becomes available, the Department should be notified and provided an opportunity to offer comments regarding the updated information.
