The project is located in Sacramento County on SR 51 from postmile 8.2 to 8.7 and I-80 from postmile M6.6 to M8.7. The four bridges included in this project have bridge railings that are not compliant to the current standards. The purpose of this project is to upgrade non-standard bridge rails to current standards. Caltrans proposes a bridge railing replacement for four (4) bridge structures, as well as bridge widening on one (1) bridge structure, on State Route (SR) 51 and Interstate 80 (I-80) in Sacramento County. A list of the 4 bridges and the project scope is included on page 2.



Project Description

The 4 bridges in the project include the following structures:

- Rio Linda Boulevard (Blvd.) Undercrossing (Bridge # 24-0203) on I-80 at PM M6.6
- Winters Street Undercrossing (UC) (Bridge # 24-0205) on I-80 at PM M8.67
- SR 51/244, 80 Separator (Bridge # 24-0291L) on SR 51 at PM 8.46
- SR 51/244, 80 Connector (Bridge # 24-0293R) on SR 51 at PM 8.52

All four bridges listed above will have the bridge railing replaced.

The project will widen a section on SR 51 from PM 8.2 to PM 8.7 and widen Bridge No. 24-0293R to provide a standard shoulder within the project limits.

The scope of work also includes the following:

- Removal and replacement of guardrails and traffic stripes
- Road cut and fill
- Paving
- Temporary ramp closures
- Night work
- Ground disturbance
- Vegetation and tree removal

Staging:

- All staging would occur within the Caltrans right of way (ROW).

Disposal/Borrow:

- No borrow or disposal is required.

Right of Way:

- All work would occur within the Caltrans ROW.

Consultant/Coordination:

- No need for consultation or coordination.

Permits:

- No permits are required.

Environmental Commitments:

The following environmental commitments are required pursuant to CEQA:

Biology:

- If construction occurs during the migratory bird nesting season (February 1 – September 30), a contractor supplied Biologist will need to perform Nesting Bird Surveys within 7 days prior to the start of work.
- Bird exclusion devices will be required if the construction work is performed during the migratory bird nesting season (February 1 – September 30).
