Project Description:

The California Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC), pursuant to authority granted under California Code of Regulations, Title 22, Division 4.5, Chapter 20, Section 66270.61, has issued an Emergency Permit to World Oil Environmental Services (WOES), (EPA ID# CAT080035711) to transfer hazardous waste from a tanker truck into an approved truck and/or container. The permit allows for approximately 700 gallons of ignitable used antifreeze to be transferred once the waste has been repackaged by WOES and transferred into an approved truck and/or container.

Background:

A WOES tanker truck picked up used antifreeze from various generators for disposal at the Fontana, California facility. The total available capacity of the truck's compartment that held the used antifreeze is 700 gallons. Upon arrival to the WOES facility, the used antifreeze was tested and found to have a flash point of less than 140°F. 535 gallons of the contaminated used antifreeze were in the truck's compartment. The low flash point classifies the waste as hazardous waste under the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA). WOES does not have a permit to manage RCRA hazardous waste and the tanker truck does not meet the Department of Transportation (DOT) specifications that would allow it to transport ignitable hazardous waste.

Project Activities:

The contaminated used antifreeze that is now classified as a RCRA hazardous waste must be repackaged into a DOT truck and/or UN approved container prior to offering it to an authorized disposal facility, World Oil Recycling Center in Compton, California.

Within 10 business days of the expiration of this permit, WOES will submit a final report, signed in accordance with Title 22, California Code of Regulations section 66270.11(d). The report shall include certification that the transfer area has been cleared of all residual hazardous waste generated from this emergency treatment and all generated waste has been properly managed.

The Emergency Permit is effective from December 19, 2019 through March 19, 2020.

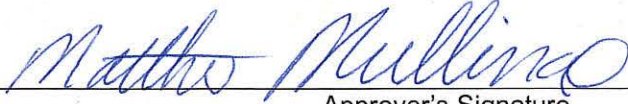
