Good day. The City of East Palo Alto had previously prepared and sent to you a Draft Environmental Impact Report (DEIR) for public review and comment pertaining to the Woodland Park Euclid Improvements Project (SCH No. 2020040270). The City has decided to extend the public review period to September 15. Related changes to the Notice of Availability have been made since it was originally published with the State. An updated Notice of Availability is being submitted to the State Clearinghouse by City Consultant Kimley Horn.

Project Location: 3.92-acre project site is on East Palo Alto's west side, located northwest of University Avenue, adjacent to U.S. 101 and northwest of the University Circle office and hotel complex (2001 Manhattan Avenue). The project area consists of a grouping of 14 individual parcels/addresses. The primary project parcels front Euclid Avenue, bounded by West Bayshore Road, Manhattan Avenue, and O'Connor Street. A water tank is also proposed as part of the project, located at 375 Donohoe Street.
