DESCRIPTION OF THE NATURE AND PURPOSE OF PROJECT: Install four regulatory signs at highly visible locations near entrances of key parking areas at Crystal Cove State Park to warn park visitors of the threat of theft to parked vehicles. The project involves installing signage within the road prism for the parking lots with no significant resources.
