


A record search of the Native American Heritage Commission (NAHC) Sacred Lands File (SLF) was completed for the information you have submitted for the above referenced project. The results were negative. However, the absence of specific site information in the SLF does not indicate the absence of cultural resources in any project area. 



I have conducted a thorough search of our paleontology collection records for the locality and specimen data for the proposed Yucca Terrace Drive Warehouse Development Project, McKenna et al. Job No. 20.2070, in the City of Hesperia, San Bernardino County, project area as outlined on the portion of the Baldy Mesa USGS topographic quadrangle map that you sent to me on 7 March 2020. We do not have any vertebrate fossil localities that lie directly within the proposed project area boundaries, but we do have localities nearby from sedimentary deposits similar to those that may occur at depth in the proposed project area.

Surficial sediments in the entire proposed project area consist of younger Quaternary Alluvium, derived as alluvial fan deposits from the San Gabriel Mountains to the south. These deposits typically do not contain significant vertebrate fossils in the uppermost layers, but they may be underlain by older Quaternary deposits that do contain significant vertebrate fossil remains. Our closest fossil vertebrate locality in these older Quaternary deposits is LACM 1224, northeast of the proposed project area west of Spring Valley Lake, that produced a specimen of fossil camel, *Camelops*. Additionally, east-noutheast of the proposed project area, on the western side of the Mojave River below the bluffs, an otherwise unrecorded specimen of mammoth was collected in 1961 from older Quaternary Alluvium deposits. Further to the north-northwest of

the proposed project area, between Adelanto and the former George Air Force Base, our older Quaternary locality LACM 7786 produced a fossil specimen of meadow vole, *Microtus*.

Shallow excavations in the younger Quaternary Alluvium in the proposed project area are unlikely to produce significant vertebrate fossils. Deeper excavations in the proposed project area that extend down into older Quaternary deposits, however, may well encounter significant fossil vertebrate remains. Any substantial excavations in the proposed project area, therefore, should be monitored closely to quickly and professionally recover any fossil remains discovered while not impeding development. Also, sediment samples should be collected and processed to determine the small fossil potential in the proposed project area. Any fossils recovered during mitigation should be deposited in an accredited and permanent scientific institution for the benefit of current and future generations.

This records search covers only the vertebrate paleontology records of the Natural History Museum of Los Angeles County. It is not intended to be a thorough paleontological survey of the proposed project area covering other institutional records, a literature survey, or any potential on-site survey.








Overview of Property from 463827E/3810461N; W)




Fenceline Identified along Aqueduct in Northeast Corner of Property (464239E/3810471N; N)





This update applies to a segment of Oro Grande Wash Road, which had been previously recorded as an unimproved dirt road near a wash located adjacent to the right of way (ROW) of the East Branch of the California Aqueduct (EBA). Oro Grande Wash Road is a historic, late 19th century road that appeared on both the on the Southern California No. 1 USGS map (1902) and the Hesperia (1909) 15' quad.

This site was **not** relocated during survey for the Department of Water Resources' East Branch Enlargement Project. Survey was conducted solely within the fenced California Aqueduct ROW.

Based on historic maps, Oro Grande Wash Road appears to have run along the north bank of the Oro Grande Wash near a California Aqueduct culvert at mile marker 394.51, however there are several other trails, many highly disturbed by OHV activity, running through and near the wash so it is not apparent which is the resource. In any case, field inspection was unable to definitively identify this resource among the other trails located near where the resource had been previously recorded. The portion of the trail extending into the ROW of the EBA appears to have been destroyed by construction of the EBA and is no longer visible.

The location of the resource as noted on the attached location map is based on the 1909 Hesperia 15' USGS topographic map.


