Project Description (Proposed actions, location, and/or consequences).

The project proposes repairs of approximately 3,370 linear feet of levees along the Cosumnes River in the vicinity of Wilton and Sloughhouse. The levees to be repaired have been severely eroded at nine separately accessed locations. Proposed repair work would generally consist of re-grading and fill of the existing levee sections to correct past erosion, and the placement of new rock slope protection (RSP) to prevent future erosion. The project would require permit authorizations from the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (Corps), the California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW), and the Central Valley Regional Water Quality Control Board (RWQCB).

Identify the project's significant or potentially significant effects and briefly describe any proposed mitigation measures that would reduce or avoid that effect.

Effects on special-status wildlife species, will be mitigated by construction scheduling, purchase of mitigation credits, pre-construction surveys and implementation of protective measures recommended by the biologist for impact avoidance.

Inadvertent impacts on cultural resources, including Tribal Cultural Resources, during construction will be mitigated by pre-construction tailgate training of construction workers, inspection of findings by qualified archaeologist and contact with coroner, Native American representatives and other officials in the event of a find.
