Project Description (Proposed actions, location, and/or consequences).

The project consists on the closure of the Imperial Solid Waste Site, which is an existing landfill with a total disposal area footprint of approximately 18 acres. The landfill ceased operation on 29 July 2018 and was converted to a transfer station on 1 March 2019. The landfill has reached the maximum permitted capacity and therefore requires closure in accordance with Title 27 CCR Section 21110. Activities include waste relocation, cover soil import, engineered fill placement and compaction, and installation of stormwater management features. The estimated time frame to complete the closure tasks described for the site is approximately 4 to 6 months.

Identify the project's significant or potentially significant effects and briefly describe any proposed mitigation measures that would reduce or avoid that effect.

The IS/MND concludes that no significant unavoidable environmental effects would occur as a result of the proposed project. Potentially significant impacts related to air quality, biological, erosion control, hazards and hazardous materials, greenhouse gas emissions and utilities and service systems were identified and mitigation measures were proposed. If implemented, they would lower potential impacts to less than significant levels.

If applicable, describe any of the project's areas of controversy known to the Lead Agency, including issues raised by agencies and the public.

Imperial County Air Pollution Control District: informs that a Dust Control Plan will be required and that the project shall show compliance with all rules of Regulation VIII.

CalRecycle: requested minor corrections to clarify that an Mitigated Negative Declaration (MND) would be prepared and not a Negative Declaration (ND). Also identified a section that need to be corrected under Public Services category and that all mitigation measures be included in the MMRP. All changes were incorporated into the CEQA document.
