Project Description (Proposed actions, location, and/or consequences).

The proposed project includes final closure of the Hot Spa Solid Waste Site (HSSWS), which is an existing landfill with a total disposal area footprint of approximately 6.4 acres. The HSSWS began operations as a municipal solid waste landfill in the mid 1960's and operated until July 29, 2018. It was then later converted to a transfer station in 2019. The closure will include waste relocation, borrow soil excavation and placement as cover soil, fill placement and compaction, and installation of storm water management features. The landfill has reached maximum permitted capacity and requires closure in accordance with 27 CCR Section 21110. The estimated time frame to complete the closure tasks described for the site is approximately 2 to 3 months.

Identify the project's significant or potentially significant effects and briefly describe any proposed mitigation measures that would reduce or avoid that effect.

The IS/MND concludes that no significant unavoidable environmental effects would occur as a result of the proposed project. Potentially significant impacts related to air quality, biological resources, greenhouse gas emissions, hazard and hazardous materials, erosion control, hydrology and water quality systems were identified and mitigation measures were proposed. If implemented, they would lower potential impacts to less than significant levels.

Imperial County Air Pollution Control District: informs that a Dust Control Plan will be required and that the project shall show compliance with all rules of Regulation VIII.
