Project Title: Stream Crossing Installation for Homesite Access (Lake or Streambed Alteration Agreement No. 1600-2020-0119-R1)

Project Location (include county): The project is located on Kellogg Gulch off Brady Road in the community of Hayfork, Trinity County. Kellogg Gulch is a tributary to Hayfork Creek. Assessor's Parcel Number 011-330-47-00, 40°43'013"N, 123°11'20.6"W.

Project Description: The California Department of Fish and Wildlife has executed Lake and Streambed Alteration Agreement number 1600-2020-0119-R1, pursuant to Section 1602 of the Fish and Game Code to Yia Chang.

The project is limited to installation of a minimum 36" culvert on a private driveway to allow year-round residential access to the eastern half of the parcel. The culvert will cross Kellogg Gulch, a Class-II waterway and the inlet will have a beveled inlet to direct flow, as well as 12" rip-rap around the inlet and outlet to protect from scour. No large trees or native riparian vegetation will be removed as part of the project.


Statutory Exemption.

Categorical Exemption. Type – Class 3; California Code of Regulations, title 14, section 15303

Consists of construction and location of limited numbers of new, small facilities or structures; installation of small new equipment and facilities in small structures; and the conversion of existing small structures from one use to another where only minor modifications are made in the exterior of the structure.

Reasons why project is exempt: The project consists of construction of one new small crossing on an intermittent stream to access one new residential structure. There will be no significant adverse impacts on endangered, rare, or threatened species of their habitat pursuant to California Code of Regulations, title 14, section 15065.
