Project Description (Proposed actions, location, and/or consequences).

Placer County Department of Public Works, in cooperation with the California Department of Transportation (Caltrans), proposes roadway improvements at and around the intersection of North Shore Boulevard (State Route 267) and North Lake Boulevard (State Route 28) within the unincorporated community of Kings Beach to enhance the safety and mobility of all roadway users, and to expand the streetscape aesthetics of the area.

Identify the project's significant or potentially significant effects and briefly describe any proposed mitigation measures that would reduce or avoid that effect.

The project could have potentially significant effects on Biological Resources, Hazards and Hazardous Materials, and Tribal Cultural Resources. These effects can be reduced to be less than significant with the following incorporated mitigation measures: MM BIO-1: For construction activities during the typical bird nesting season, a qualified biologist shall be retained to conduct a survey of the project area and a 100-foot buffer, as access is available, to locate active bird nests, identify measures to protect the nests, and locate any other special status species. MM BIO-2: Tree or shrub removal shall occur during the non-breeding season. If not possible, for disturbances during the breeding season a qualified biologist shall conduct a survey for nesting birds in all trees within the operation footprint and within 250 feet of the project area. If nesting birds are detected, a suitable activity-free buffer shall be established and appropriately maintained. MM HAZ-1: Develop Lead Compliance Plan (LCP). The LCP shall outline requirements mandated in 8 CCR 1532.1. MM TCR-1: County shall retain a qualified archaeologist to prepare an Archaeological Monitoring Plan (AMP) prior to ground disturbance. The plan shall identify the need for monitoring by an archaeologist and Native American monitors. MM TCR-2: County shall retain an archaeological monitor and Native American monitors as prescribed by the AMP. The monitors shall be granted stop-work authority in the event an inadvertent discovery is made. MM TCR-3: Contractor and key staff shall be instructed to be wary of possibility of destruction of buried cultural resources. If cultural resources are discovered, all activities in the immediate area will halt, the archaeologist will be notified, along with County, Washoe Tribe, and Colfax-Todds Valley Consolidated Tribe to determine appropriate course of action.
