Project Description

The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) proposes to preserve the existing facility and prevent further deterioration of the roadway by proposing an HM 122 Pavement Maintenance Project located in Yolo County on Route 128 from Postmile 0.0 to 9.8. The target construction year is 2021. The project proposes to place Rubberized Hot Mix Asphalt–Type G (RHMA-G_ and Rubberized Hot Mix Asphalt - Open Grade (RHMA-O) from Edge of Pavement (EP) to EP. The project work would include:

- Overlay .25' (0.15' RHMA-G, 0.1' RHMA-O) from PM 0.0 to PM 6.3
- 0.25' Cold Plane AC pavement in various locations from PM 8.1-PM 9.8 and place 0.15' RHMA-G, 0.1' RHMA-O
- Digouts (Various Locations)
- Possible replacement of MBGR
- Replace Rumble Strips, if applicable
- Replace traffic striping and markings within the project limits
