Title: Rodeo Renewed Project

Applicant: Phillips 66 Company

Location: Filled and unfilled sovereign land in Carquinez Strait, town of Rodeo, Contra Costa County

Description: The project will modify the existing Rodeo refinery into a repurposed facility that would discontinue the refining of petroleum crude oil and switch to processing renewable feedstocks into renewable diesel fuel, renewable blending components, and renewable fuel gas. The State Lands Commission action is an amendment of a 30-year General Lease – Industrial Use through 2031, to expand authorized uses of the leased lands to include transfer of renewable fuels and feedstocks, to install a Metocean Monitoring Buoy System, and to modify the butane rail rack.

This is to advise that the California State Lands Commission, as Lead Agency Responsible Agency, approved the above-described project on August 17, 2023, and made the following determinations regarding the project.

- 1) The project will will not have a significant effect on the environment.
- 2) An Environmental Impact Report (EIR) was prepared pursuant to the provisions of CEQA.
- 3) Mitigation measures were were not made a condition of the approval of the project.
- 4) A mitigation reporting or monitoring plan was or was not adopted for this project.
- 5) A Statement of Overriding Considerations was was not adopted for the project.
- 6) Findings were were not made pursuant to the provisions of CEQA.

The lead agency for the project, Contra Costa County (County), adopted the Environmental Impact Report (EIR) and Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Program and approved the project on May 3, 2022. The California State Lands Commission has considered the EIR as prepared for this project by the County and adopted an independent Mitigation Monitoring Program incorporating the County's document.
