LOCATION: Caswell Memorial State Park

DESCRIPTION OF THE NATURE AND PURPOSE OF PROJECT: The project is intended to restore riparian woodland habitat within Caswell Memorial State Park and control invasive species, work will:

- Expand efforts to control exotic species, especially ailanthus, wild fig, arundo, Himalayan blackberry, and milk thistle;
- Manually and/or chemically treating Ailanthus and California grape using cut-stump treatment methods, according to PCA Recommendation No. 181211B from Wilbur-Ellis; and
- Manually removing and pile burning or chipping excess fuel loading. Vegetative piles will either be burned in place when conditions are conducive or relocated to another location within the Park to either be burned at later date or chipped.
