The California Department of Fish and Wildlife (Department) has reviewed the Mitigative Negative Declaration (MND) dated February 5, 2021, for the above-referenced project (Project). The Department's review of this Project is pursuant to our role as the State's trustee and responsible agency for fish and wildlife resources under the California Environmental Quality Act, California Public Resources Code section 21000 et seq.

The Project proposes to *"execute remedial action at the former Fall River Mills Trap Club to address surface and subsurface contamination associated with the historical operation of the trap club. Environmental investigation activities have been performed at the former trap club on behalf of PG&E, in association with its Land Conservation Commitment (LCC) program."* The Project will remove approximately 2,700 cubic yards of soil containing lead shot over a 3-acre area to a depth of 0.5 to 1.5 feet. The Project is located approximately 1.2 miles northwest of the intersection of Glenburn Road and Highway 299E. Based on the information provided, Applicant-Proposed Measures and Department review, we have no comments at this time. If the Project description changes in any way or additional biological resource information becomes available, the Department should be notified and provided an opportunity to offer comments regarding the updated information.
