**Project Title:** Aratina Solar Farm Project by 64NB 8me LLC; 91MC, 8me LLC; 45MG 8me LLC; 104KB 8me LLC; 156KA 8me LLC (California Endangered Species Act Incidental Take Permit No. 2081-2020-022-04 (ITP)); Minor Amendment No.1.

**Project Location:** The Project is generally located within an unincorporated area in the southeastern corner of Kern County and a portion of San Bernadino County, south and west of the unincorporated community of Boron.

**Project Description:** The Project includes the construction, operation, and maintenance of a photovoltaic (PV) solar facility that will include service roads, photovoltaic panels supported on solar trackers, a power collection system, communication cables, overhead and underground gen-tie transmission lines, electrical switchyards, substations, energy storage system(s), weather stations, and operations and maintenance facilities.

The Project will result in permanent impacts throughout the 2,435-acre Project Area to desert tortoise (*Gopherus agassizii*) and Mohave ground squirrel (*Xerospermophilus mohavensis*) habitat. The project is expected to result in incidental take of desert tortoise and Mohave ground squirrel, which are designated as a threatened species under the California Endangered Species Act. The ITP referenced above as issued by CDFW authorizes incidental take of species listed under CESA that may occur as a result of Project implementation. Minor Amendment No.1 modifies compensatory mitigation language related to the Co-Management Agreement, and removes references to the Enhancement and Monitoring Plan requirements.
