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NOTICE

Each project applicant shall remit to the county clerk the environmental filing fee before or at the time of filing a Notice of Determination (Pub. Resources Code, § 21152; Fish & G. Code, § 7114, subdivision (d); Cal. Code Regs., tit. 14, § 753.5). Without the appropriate fee, statutory or categorical exemption, or a valid No Effect Determination issued by the California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW), the Notice of Determination is not operative, vested, or final, and shall not be accepted by the county clerk.

COUNTY DOCUMENTARY HANDLING FEE

The county clerk may charge a documentary handling fee of fifty dollars (\$50) per filing in addition to the environmental filing fee (Fish & G. Code, § 7114, subd. (e); Cal. Code Regs., tit. 14, § 753.5, subd. (g)(1)). A county board of supervisors shall have the authority to increase or decrease the fee or charge, that is otherwise authorized to be levied by another provision of law, in the amount reasonably necessary to recover the cost of providing any product or service or the cost of enforcing any regulation for which the fee or charge is levied (Gov. Code, § 54985, subd. (a)).

COLLECTION PROCEDURES FOR COUNTY GOVERNMENTS

Filing Notice of Determination (NOD):

- Collect environmental filing fee or copy of previously issued cash receipt. *(Do not collect fee if project applicant presents a No Effect Determination signed by CDFW. An additional fee is required for each separate environmental document. An addendum is not considered a separate environmental document. Checks should be made payable to the county.)*
- Issue cash receipt to project applicant.
- Attach copy of cash receipt and, if applicable, previously issued cash receipt, to NOD.
- Mail filing fees for CRP document to CDFW prior to filing the NOD or equivalent final approval (Cal. Code Regs. Tit. 14, § 753.5 (b)(5)). The CRP should request receipt from CDFW to show proof of payment for filing the NOD or equivalent approval. Please mail payment to address below made attention to the Cash Receipts Unit of the Accounting Services Branch.

If the project applicant presents a **No Effect Determination** signed by CDFW, also:

- Attach No Effect Determination to NOD *(no environmental filing fee is due)*.

Filing Notice of Exemption (NOE) (Statutorily or categorically exempt project (Cal. Code Regs., tit. 14, §§ 15280-15285, 16300-16333))

- Issue cash receipt to project applicant.
- Attach copy of cash receipt to NOE *(no environmental filing fee is due)*.

Within 30 days after the end of each month in which the environmental filing fees are collected, each county shall summarize and record the amount collected on the monthly State of California Form No. CA25 (TC31) and remit the amount collected to the State Treasurer. Identify the remittance on Form No. CA25 as "Environmental Document Filing Fees" per Fish and Game Code section 7114.

The county clerk shall mail the following documents to CDFW on a monthly basis:

- ✓ A photocopy of the monthly State of California Form No. CA25 (TC31)
- ✓ CDFW/ASB copies of all cash receipts (including all voided receipts)
- ✓ A copy of all CDFW No Effect Determinations filed in lieu of fee payment.
- ✓ A copy of all NODs filed with the county during the preceding month
- ✓ A list of the name, address and telephone number of all project applicants for which an NOD has been filed. If this information is contained on the cash receipt filed with CDFW under California Code of Regulations, title 14, section 753.5, subdivision (e)(6), no additional information is required.

DOCUMENT RETENTION

The county shall retain two copies of the cash receipt (for lead agency and county clerk) and a copy of all documents described above for at least 12 months.

RECEIPT NUMBER

- # The first two digits automatically populate by making the appropriate selection in the County/State Agency of Filing drop-down menu.
- # The next eight digits automatically populate when a date is entered.
- # The last three digits correspond with the sequential order of issuance for each calendar year. For example, the first receipt number issued on January 1 should end in 001. If a county issued 252 receipts for the year ending on December 31, the last receipt number should end in 252. CDFW recommends that counties and state agencies 1) save a local copy of this form, and 2) track receipt numbers on a spreadsheet (labeled by month to ensure accuracy).

Description of Nature, Purpose, and Beneficiaries of Project:

The proposed project is a grant-funded project administered by the California Air Resources Board (CARB), includes the implementation of electric shared mobility services (electric vehicles and e-bike sharing) and a workforce development program within the City of Stockton of San Joaquin County. The mobility services portion of the project will include the installation of 15-20 small electric bike charging docking stations in public and private rights-of-way which are approximate 1'x3' in size. The round-trip e-carsharing project includes 30 battery-electric vehicles distribution to 10-15 locations throughout the project area. This will include the installation of bollard-style electric vehicle charging stations near parking stalls. There will be line (conduit) extensions from common area panel to the charging stations. Software at charging stations and/or at panel to also be installed. Additionally, this project will expand the existing transit trip planning capabilities in the Vamos MaaS (Mobility-as-a-Service) smartphone application. Lastly, the project will also provide discounts and/or funds through the Vamos MaaS to community members who qualify as transport-disadvantaged. The workforce development portion of this project will create an apprenticeship programs in e-shared mobility operations in the City of Stockton. The project will provide 10-20 full-time jobs and training to support the maintenance of the electric vehicle and e-bike infrastructure. The purpose of this project is to increase travel reliability and options for the City's residents, with an emphasis on the City's disadvantaged communities. The e-carsharing program will provide residents with a new way to travel to destinations that are not feasible to access by existing transit. The e-bikes will improve first-and-last-mile access to transit and provide an alternative travel mode to supplement infrequent transit service. The expansion of MaaS will provide

residents with an easy and accessible way to purchase tickets and trip planning. The planning process will include ongoing and effective community outreach to promote both engagement and education of the projects. Beneficiaries include the public and residents of San Joaquin County at large, with a specific emphasis on residents that reside in a disadvantaged community or are transport-disadvantaged.

Reasons why project is exempt: This project qualifies under Section 15183 Projects Consistent with a Community Plan, General Plan, or Zoning as the project is consistent with the 2018 San Joaquin Council of Governments Regional Transportation Plan/Sustainable Communities Strategy (RTP/SCS) and City of Stockton's Envision 2040 General Plan. An EIR was previously certified by the lead agency for, the above identified Plans, or Sustainable Communities Strategy.

This project qualifies under Section 15301(1)(a) Existing Facilities, Section 15302(2)(b) Replacement or Reconstruction, Section 15303(d) Construction/Conversion of New/Small Structures, Section 15304(f) Minor Alterations of Land because the project consists of minor alteration of existing facilities and/or mechanical equipment involving negligible or no expansion of capacity and/or minor alterations to land, including minor trenching and backfilling where surface is restored. All power will be provided by from the existing electrical panel and the work includes installations of conduit, wiring, electrical connections, and mounting equipment. Minor trenching may be required to bring power from local sources to proposed EV chargers. This project also qualifies under Section 15306 Information Collection because the overarching purpose of the project is to conduct research for the purpose of collecting data on the use of electric mobility services.
