Project Title: UPE18-0054 Saints Peter and Paul Russian Orthodox Church Cemetery

Project Description (Proposed actions, location, and/or consequences).

A proposal to develop a cemetery containing a 10.07-acre burial ground with approximately 4,125 tombs to be built in a three phase (86-year) period on a 21-acre parcel located at 3367 Stony Point Road in Santa Rosa, California. The project would also include the construction of a refrigeration building, equipment storage building, columbarium, access roads, parking lot, and memorial plaza. Hours of operation are proposed between 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., Monday through Sunday. Administrative operations, including scheduling, would be conducted by the church's existing staff. The cemetery expects to host four to six gravesite services per month which would typically be attended by five to 25 people and last less than an hour. Up to four larger gatherings would be conducted per year; the largest of which, for an Easter celebration, would accommodate up to 150 attendees.

Identify the project's significant or potentially significant effects and briefly describe any proposed mitigation measures that would reduce or avoid that effect.

- Air Quality: Implement dust control measures and BAAQMD BMPs
- Biological Resources: Update biological resource survey prior to the construction of each construction phase; purchase offsite mitigation credits for Sebastopol Meadowfoam; avoid/transplant Lobb's Buttercup; conduct environmental awareness training for construction employees; installation of fencing for sensitive habitat; purchase credits for CA Tiger Salamander habitat acreage or create offsite protected preserve of the same (or larger acreage); consultation with USFW to determine potential wetland impacts and potentially required mitigation credits; CA/US habitat BMPs and avoidance; preconstruction surveys for nesting birds
- Geology and Soils: Conduct paleontological sensitivity training for construction personnel and periodic spot checks during grading and earth-disturbing activities
- Noise: Locate large gravesites within central portion of cemetery burial area; utilize temporary noise barriers to screen residences from large gravesite services; 24-hour notice of 3-gun salutes shall be provided to all neighboring residences within 600 feet; regulate construction activities (hours, operation, protocol);
- Tribal Cultural Resources: Conduct archaeological sensitivity training for construction personnel and periodic spot checks during grading and earth-disturbing activities
