



NOTICE OF AVAILABILITY OF THE DRAFT INITIAL STUDY WITH PROPOSED MITIGATED NEGATIVE DECLARATION FOR THE PLACER-49 SAFETY BARRIER PROJECT NORTH OF AUBURN IN PLACER COUNTY

WHAT IS PLANNED

The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) proposes a project on State Route (SR) 49 in Placer County, north of Auburn from (Post Mile [PM]) R8.7 to R10.6. This project proposes to construct a concrete median barrier on SR 49, between Lorensen Road/Florence Lane and Lone Star Road to reduce the number and severity of cross median collisions within this segment. In addition, construction of traffic features at Lorensen Road/Florence Lane and Lone Star Road intersections are proposed to accommodate U-turn movements for out-of-direction travel resulting from the construction of the concrete median barrier.


INVITING PUBLIC INVOLVEMENT
