Project Description (Proposed actions, location, and/or consequences).

The proposed project would perform pipeline strength tests, replace transmission pipeline, and install distribution pipeline within a 8-mile stretch between post miles 27.4 and 35.5 on State Route 29. The project is needed to assess and ensure the safety of the pipeline installed in 1930 between the cities of St. Helena and Calistoga, and improve the transmission and distribution system's capacity to meet projected demand for natural gas.

Identify the project's significant or potentially significant effects and briefly describe any proposed mitigation measures that would reduce or avoid that effect.

The project, with mitigation measures incorporated, will have less than significant impact on Air Quality and Cultural Resources. These mitigation measures are:

MM AQ-1. Use of Tier 4 Equipment. All off-road diesel-powered heavy equipment used to construct the Project will be equipped with Tier 4 engines, except for specialized equipment or when Tier 4 engines are not available. Retrofits that achieve or exceed emission reductions equivalent to that of a Tier 4 engine may be used in lieu of Tier 4 engines.

MM CUL-6: Data Recovery at Archaeological Sites Determined to be Eligible per California and National Register Criteria in ADI. At archeological sites that are identified as being historical resources, data recovery will be implemented prior to Project commencement. Data recovery will be guided by a data recovery plan produced by PG&E in coordination with State Parks, interested parties (e.g., the Mishewal-Wappo Tribe of Alexander Valley and Middletown Rancheria), and Caltrans PQS.
