Project Description (Proposed actions, location, and/or consequences).

The project is the construction, use and maintenance of six (6)-story, 69-unit apartment building up to 75 feet in height over a partially subterranean garage on one (1) lot with a total area of approximately 16,954.83 square feet. The project includes a minimum of 50 vehicle parking spaces, 61 bicycle parking spaces, 7,650 square feet of open space, and a minimum of 69 trees. The project proposes to cut 4,200 cubic yards and a haul route to export a total of 4,200 cubic yards of soil. The project will cut approximately six (6) to eight (8) feet below the existing grade in order to accommodate the partially subterranean parking level. No fill or import of soil is proposed and there are no Protected Trees on-site.

The project site was determined to have a potential significant impact in the creation of a significant hazard to the public or the environment through reasonably foreseeable upset and accident conditions involving the release of hazardous materials into the environment. Mitigation Measures imposed to address potential impacts include MM-1, MM-2, and MM-3, which address existing oil wells on-site and contaminated soil.
