**Project Title:** Canine Early Development Center Expansion Project (California Endangered Species Act (CESA) Incidental Take Permit No. 2081-2021-098-03 (ITP))

**Project Location:** The Project is located at 2965 Dutton Avenue in the City of Santa Rosa, Sonoma County. The Project footprint is 2.98-acres and is located on Assessor's Parcel Number 043-135-031 within Township 07N, Range 08W, Section 34 of the Santa Rosa U.S. Geological Survey 7.5-minute quadrangle map, Mt. Diablo meridian, centered at an approximate Latitude 38.40864 and Longitude -122.72461.

**Project Description:** The Project includes the development of 2.98 acres of undeveloped land into a Canine Early Development Center, veterinary clinic, and animal hospital. Project activities include grubbing and grading of the entire Project site, trench digging, installing storm drain lines, and other activities within the 2.98-acre Project footprint. The Project will take approximately 14 months to complete.

The Project will result in permanent impacts to 2.98 acres of California tiger salamander (*Ambystoma californiense*) upland habitat. The project is expected to result in incidental take of California tiger salamander, which is designated as a threatened species under CESA. The ITP referenced above as issued by CDFW authorizes incidental take of species listed under CESA that may occur as a result of Project implementation.
