Project Description (Proposed actions, location, and/or consequences).

Description - To allow for the recordation and development of a 65-lot single family residential subdivision (Vesting Tentative Tract Map 20368) with 7,200 sq. ft. minimum size lots, on an approximately 18.1 acre building site that is vacant and undeveloped with an approximate density of 3.6 units per acre.

Location - Southeast corner of Eucalyptus Street and Topaz Road (APN No. 0405-322-08 & 09)

Identify the project's significant or potentially significant effects and briefly describe any proposed mitigation measures that would reduce or avoid that effect.

The recordation and development of the proposed single-family residential subdivision will not create any significant impacts with the included mitigation measures as proposed. Mitigation measures have been included in the Initial Study and Draft Mitigated Negative Declaration regarding Biological Measures, Cultural Resources and Tribal Cultural Resources, Geology and Soils, and Noise that will reduce any potential impacts to a level of less than significant.

Joshua Trees were identified within the project vicinity; however, mitigation measures have been included to address this issue. No additional known areas of controversy conveyed to City Staff at this time.
