The U.S. Department of the Interior/Bureau of Land Management (BLM) prepared an Environmental Assessment/Finding of No Significant Impact (FONSI) for the above-named project, which identifies and evaluates the potential for significant environmental impacts from the proposed project. The BLM completed its review of the FONSI and signed a Record of Decision on March 17, 2020 approving the proposed project.

In accordance with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) (PRC §21000, *et seq.*) and the CEQA Guidelines (14 CCR 15000, *et seq.*), and the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA), the California Division of Oil, Gas, and Geothermal Resources (Division) is the CEQA lead agency for the proposed project, while the BLM is the NEPA lead agency. The Division has reviewed BLM's approved FONSI (DOI-BLM-CA-CO60-2021-0007-EA) and finds that it meets the requirements of CEQA. BLM found that the project will not have a significant effect on the environment; therefore, the Division intends to use the FONSI rather than preparing a Negative Declaration for this project.

Project Description: The Division received two (2) Notices of Intention to Drill (NOIs) from the Applicant to conduct well operations on mineral and surface estates administered by the BLM Bakersfield Field Office within the Buena Vista Oilfield in Kern County. The proposed project consists of permitting expanding an existing well pad on an existing developed area, drilling two new wells, installation of associated new 3-inch and 4-inch steel pipelines and two power poles to accommodate the drilling of 2 new wells: 624H-6D and 658H-36-6D.

The proposed project site is not present on any of the lists enumerated under Section 65962.5 of the Government Code including, but not limited to lists of hazardous waste facilities, land designated as hazardous waste property and hazardous waste disposal sites, and the information in the *Hazardous Waste and Substances Statement* required under subdivision (f) of that section.

Public Review Period: BLM held a 30-day public review period for the proposed project, which began on December 12, 2019 and ended on January 12, 2020. BLM posts Applications for Permit to Drill (APDs) in the front lobby of their Bakersfield Field Office located at 3801 Pegasus Drive, Bakersfield, CA. Additionally, BLM lists the environmental documents prepared for proposed projects on the California BLM NEPA webpage (see link below) to notify the public of the proposed projects and to invite any comments from those interested.
