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Continuation sheet:

The project would install a concrete pad, electrical cabinet, a changeable message sign, and a 35-foot pole with a camera. The sign display would be 25 feet wide by 7 feet tall and sit on a 5-foot diameter pile buried 22 feet below ground. The camera pole would also have a 2.5-foot diameter pile installed 8 feet below ground. The electrical elements would be buried in a trench 2.5 feet deep. The trench would be approximately 200 feet long. The project would take approximately 30 working days.

The purpose of the project is to communicate with the traveling public regarding upcoming roadway conditions so that they can make informed driving decisions. The project is needed because this section of US 101 is remote and road conditions can change suddenly. The segment of highway between Leggett and Confusion Hill experienced 135 collisions over a 5-year period. A changeable message sign would fulfill the project purpose by informing road users of closures or other safety concerns.

Environmental Commitments

- Water quality best management practices would be used.
- To prevent attracting corvids (birds of the Corvidae family, which include jays, crows, and ravens), no trash or foodstuffs would be left or stored on-site. All trash would be deposited in a secure container and disposed of at an approved garbage facility. Also, on-site workers would not attempt to attract or feed any wildlife.
- Any tree and shrub removal would occur between September 16th and February 14th. If trees or shrubs need to be removed outside of this work window, a qualified biologist would need to conduct a nesting bird survey. If nests are not found, vegetation must be removed within five days of the survey. If nests are found, the area would be marked as an Environmentally Sensitive Area (ESA) and the appropriate species-specific buffers would be established.
- If any special-status species are encountered during construction, they would be given a buffer and work would stop until the appropriate agency can be consulted.
- Open trenches would be covered, or escape ramps would be installed to prevent wildlife from becoming trapped overnight.
