PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The project will reduce fire hazard through removal of excess vegetation at the former Fernwood CDF fire station and later Monterey x Knobcone Seed Orchard site. One half to two thirds of shrubs and small diameter trees comprising ladder fuels will be removed. Generally, trees 8" dbh and larger will be retained except where such trees represent a safety concern. Residual trees or isolate shrubs will be spaced approximately 15 - 20 feet apart. Retained trees will be pruned to a height of 6 to 10 feet to reduce ladder fuels. Trees designated as hazard trees will be flagged for safety, these trees will be felled and bucked and either left in place or masticated. Site treatments will use an excavator style masticator and/or hand crews with chainsaws. Material cut will be chipped on site, piled for burning, or lopped and scattered.
