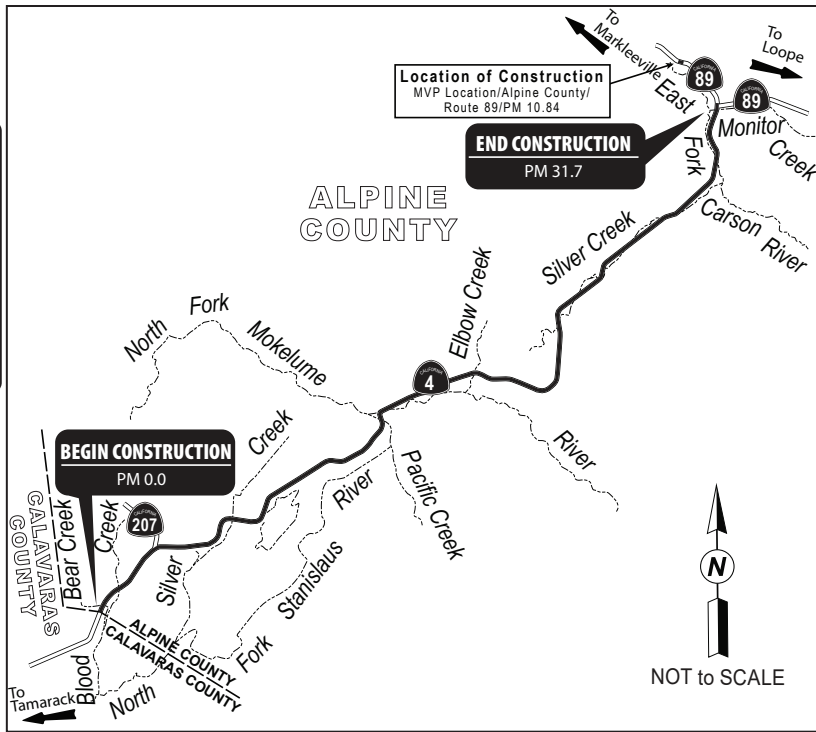


Notice of Intent to adopt a Proposed Mitigated Negative Declaration (study results available) and Section 4(f) De Minimis Determination.

Would you like a virtual public meeting for the proposed multi-objective pavement anchor project in Alpine County?

PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD

Comments will be accepted from February 25, 2022 to March 28, 2022. If there are no major comments or requests for a virtual public meeting, Caltrans will proceed with the project's design.



WHAT IS BEING PLANNED?

The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) is proposing a multi-objective anchor project and rehabilitation of existing asphalt concrete pavement on State Route 4 in from post miles 0.0 to 31.7 and State Route 89 at post mile 10.84 in Alpine County. The rehabilitation includes overlaying, digging out, cold-planing, upgrading asphalt concrete dikes and curbs, and constructing shoulder backing. The work would also modify or install the following assets to current standards: culverts, bridge-approaching metal beam guardrails, roadside signs, overhead sign structures, and maintenance vehicle pullouts.

WHY THIS PUBLIC NOTICE?

Caltrans has studied the effects this project may have on the environment. Our studies show it will not significantly affect the quality of the environment. This notice is to tell you of the availability of the Initial Study with Proposed Mitigated Negative Declaration and Section 4(f) De Minimis Determination, which you can now read and comment on.
