The Office of Emergency Management has broad responsibilities that include:

Planning and Coordination

- Coordinating the development and review of critical emergency management plans, including the County of Los Angeles
 Operational Area Emergency Operations Plan (OAEOP) and the County of Los Angeles All-Hazards Mitigation Plan.
- Providing ongoing leadership and coordination with all 88 cities, 137 special districts, and non-governmental organizations supporting emergency management within the Operational Area.
- Assisting County departments in the development of Department Emergency Plans that are consistent with the OAEOP.
- Guiding County departments in the development of Continuity of Operations plans to ensure critical functions provided by the

County of Los Angeles are able to continue following an cident or disruption.

Ipporting and advising the Board of Supervisors, Emergency Management Council, and Unified Coordination Groups on emergency management related matters before, during, and after incidents.
