

NOTICE OF INTENT TO ADOPT A MITIGATED NEGATIVE DECLARATION

The project listed below was reviewed for environmental impact by the Placer County Environmental Review Committee and was determined to have no significant effect upon the environment. A proposed Mitigated Negative Declaration and Initial Study & Checklist have been prepared for this project and have been filed with the County Clerk's office.

PROJECT: North Tahoe Shared Use Trail

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: Placer County Department of Public Works, proposes the project in order to construct 2.52 miles of shared-use paved trail, closing an important gap in the existing active transportation network in the North Lake Tahoe region. The project would provide public access to existing recreational trails, enhance accessibility to public land, provide educational and recreational opportunities, and provide a non-motorized transportation alternative for visitors and residents. Additionally, the project would enhance safety of bicyclists and connect residential neighborhoods to commercial, tourism and recreational facilities.

PROJECT LOCATION: North Lake Tahoe area of eastern Placer County, California

PROPONENT: Placer County Department of Public Works
