Project Title: Williamsen Tire Site Remediation Project

Description of Nature, Purpose, and Beneficiaries of the Project: The Williamsen Tire Site Remediation project is located at 3599 Dillon Beach Road in unincorporated Marin County, California (Assessor Parcel Number 100-100-13). The site has an estimated 5,000 altered tires stored on site adjacent to a streambed. The property owner voluntarily removed the tires that was used for erosion control and stockpiled them in an accessible area.

The owner was notified of the violations that are related to 14 CCR § 18420 (a) Applicable Facilities Acquire a Waste Tire Facility Permit, 14 CCR § 18423 Filing Application for Permit, 14 CCR § 17351 (b) Fire Equipment and Fire Lanes, 14 CCR § 17351 (c) Water Supply and Fire District Requirements, 14 CCR § 17353 (a) (b) Approved Vector Plan, 14 CCR § 17354 (d) Drainage, 14 CCR § 17354 (e) Slope/Grade, 14 CCR § 17354 (g) Rim Removal, and 14 CCR § 17354 (h) Protection from Pyrolytic Oil Runoff.

CalRecycle's Cleanup Program contractor will remove the stockpiled tires and dispose of the tires as cost effectively as possible. The tires are stockpiled onsite and there will be no soil disturbances associated with the loading, hauling, and disposal of the tires.
